LeprinoScholars Recipients Make the Grade

Since 2018, the Leprino Foods Company Foundation has been supporting postsecondary education among dependents of Leprino Foods employees through the LeprinoScholars Scholarship Program. Recipients are chosen based on academic record, community involvement, leadership, work experience and other factors in a selection process managed by an independent third party. More than 80 students applied for the 2022-23 academic year, and 20 scholarships were awarded in July.

Application Period Open Now: Submissions for the 2023-24 academic year are being accepted now through Jan. 31, 2023. The scholarship is open to dependents, up to 26 years old, of full-time Leprino Foods employees with one year or more of service (excluding dependents of senior vice presidents and above). Applicants must be high school seniors or graduates who will attend an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school in the upcoming academic year. Applications are accepted online.

ORGANIZING FOOD DRIVES AND DONATIONS
